Mental Health Counselor Job Description
Summer 2023**

Achieve partners with families from Boston to empower motivated students and close the opportunity gap. We provide transformative academic and enrichment programming from middle school to their first year of college. We foster enduring confidence and agency in our scholars through a supportive and joyful environment.

Achieve students are motivated, resilient and thoughtful young people who grow into extraordinary leaders. Our middle school scholars attend Boston's district and charter public schools, come from low-income families, and represent diverse ethnicities, religions, and family backgrounds. Achieve seeks to increase our students' academic skills, motivation, and self-confidence, and put them on the path to college.

The **Mental Health Counselor** is critical to the Achieve team, and essential to our students' academic and personal success. Candidates must possess a strong interest in working with urban students in a fun, challenging, and enriching academic environment.

Qualifications:

- Experience serving marginalized communities; demonstrated commitment to social and racial justice
- Warmth, sense of humor, ability and desire to connect with student body and faculty members
- Excellent organizational skills
- Flexibility and proactive problem-solving skills
- Strong ability to collaborate and communicate effectively
- Ability to be responsive and stay calm in crisis; aware of mandated reporter status and related obligations (filing 51A, calling BEST, making safety plans, coordinating with outside clinicians)
- LSW, LCSW, LICSW, Master's degree in counseling, PhD or PsyD in clinical psychology, or MA/CAGS in school psychology preferred

Responsibilities:

- Meet daily with students for scheduled weekly counseling sessions, with goals focused on social emotional functioning, increased frustration/distress tolerance, increased coping skills and resiliency
- Foster an environment in the counseling office of warmth, support, and unconditional positive regard
- Be available to support all students with unexpected stressors that may arise
- Support teaching staff with any mental health related questions or concerns
- Work closely with executive director to be up to date on program needs and student dynamics
- Participate fully in daily program activities, and be visible and active with students and staff in community settings
