Malia (Pride 11), Rose (Pride 11), Meggan (Pride 12) and Evy (Pride 12) were selected for Crimson Summer Academy, a competitive three-year residential academic program at Harvard.

Adrian (Pride 11) will continue at (MS)2 at Phillips Academy Andover. This three-year residential program advances diversity in the STEM fields by developing the competencies and self-confidence of outstanding high school students of color.
