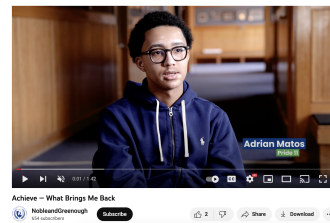
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A Message from the Director

Good evening all, my name is Tanaysha Howell and I am the mother of Dana Howell (Pride 11). Let me just say it's an honor to be here tonight to speak on the amazing journey my daughter and I have been on with the Achieve program.

I first learned about Achieve when Dana was in 6th grade at Roxbury Prep Dorchester. Nora, who was then the director of Achieve, went out to the school to speak to students and staff that might be a fit and Dana was one of the students that the teachers were sure would love the experience. Dana wanted to join primarily for the community & family feel and academic support. She was so shy and to herself that her hope was the community would help her open up and thrive as a student and friend.... It did!

I have to speak to the help and love we felt during COVID! Dana, her older brother, and I were both home for a bit over a year, and during that time, I was laid off twice! There were so many food baskets and things offered to us from Achieve. Dana was sent books to read, tutoring and of course, the Zoom calls to keep everyone connected. During what was such a hard time for my family, Achieve put a lot of light into our lives, and for that, we are forever appreciative.

During this time, Achieve was invaluable in their work with Dana and her high school applications, fees, and essays! Achieve held group sessions as well as working with Dana in the evenings individually with applications, essay questions as well as financial aid paperwork! They were tireless in the time and effort they put into Dana's process even including "mock Interviewing" to prepare her for what was to come from the schools she applied to. Dana ended up applying to 13 schools and was accepted to 9 of them!

Dana is now a sophomore at the Cambridge School of Weston with amazing grades, she is the head of Black Student Union on campus and has just planned her first "Black Legacy Gala" and she also plays volleyball.

The support from Achieve has continued with her simple day-to-day life at school. The check in's, and just her knowing she has people in her corner has been so refreshing. As a mom of a boarding student, it's hard, so the more hands in, the easier for me! However, she transitioned just fine and is doing awesome things throughout the CSW campus! "I love my life" is what she says!

Now, as an Achieve Graduate, she is there a few Saturdays a month, helping with younger students as well as taking advantage of extra help with her own classes. She's always happy to be a part of anything

because she loves the program, all she's learned and continues to learn, the new faces as well as the old!
